Read vv. 2-5

- What feelings or emotions does this story arouse in you?
- What would be some parallels in our culture to the unjust judge and the widow?

Read vv. 6-8

- What does this story teach us about the importance of tenacity, persistence, and grit in the Christian life?
- Why do you think these characteristics are so lacking in our culture? What about in Christians?
- What does this story teach us about the justice of God?
- Why is our understanding of God as a Just Judge important?

Read v1.

- Jesus gives the purpose of the parable in this first verse. How would you summarize it in your own words?
- What does it mean to lose heart?
- Why do we lose heart?
- How does this parable help us not lose heart?

Wrap Up: What are specific ways we can pray tenaciously and trust tenaciously?
