Gospel Transformation - Romans 1:1

WARM UP

 What are your thoughts and impressions as we prepare to "climb Mt. Everest" in studying the book of Romans?

DIG IN – Romans 1:1

1:1a - Transformed BY the Gospel

- What do you learn about gospel transformation from the life of Paul? (See Acts 8-9; Phil 3:5ff)
- What do you find significant about Paul's self-designation as a "servant (slave) of Christ Jesus?" What does that tell you about his mindset?
- What encouragement do you get from knowing that God has designed you to do exactly what He has prepared for you to do?
- What does Paul teach us about how Jesus can redeem our past for His good purposes?
- What do you think about the statement, "There's no such thing as a boring testimony"?

1:1b - Transformed FOR the Gospel

- Why is it important to understand that Paul was called by God to the office of Apostle?
 Why is it important to understand that office to be unique to a few men in the New Testament?
- The word "gospel" was a common term in the first century. Talk about the different ways it was used by non-Christians and Christians. Why is that distinction important?
- What are some of the other places people look for "good news" (hope, happiness, peace, fulfillment) today?
- Why do you think Paul calls it "the gospel OF GOD?" What distinctions is he making? What are the implications for our lives?

WRAP UP

- How has the gospel transformed what you were OR what you would have been?
- How does God's work in you motivate you to take His good news to a bad news world?

- Read an introduction to Romans in a study Bible, Bible dictionary, and/or commentary.
- Read Romans 1:1-7 several times and summarize the big idea in your own words.
