- Is it good to have a God we can't fully comprehend? Why?
- What do you learn about the nature and character of God from these verses?
- How does this shape your pursuit of God?

Read VV. 33-36 | Standing in Awe of God's Sovereign Glory

- What emotions or feelings do you think Paul is trying to convey in these verses?
- How do these verses highlight the "ultimacy" of God in all things?
- Why is it so important that theology always end in doxology (praise)? What dangers arise if we have one without the other?
- What are some things that can cause us to lose our awe of God. How can we regain that sense of awe?
- How do these verses impact the way we live our everyday lives?
